



In one part of the Channel opposite the Company's point there is only 37th water at high water. ships drawing 17 feet, may venture over it at high water, as the bottom is clean and no rocks, besides the water is almost always perfectly smooth.

High point which from Kangaroo Head I called middle point. To the eastward of this point about 6 miles is Kangaroo Head, and deep in this Gulf is the Pelican Lagoon.

The tides at the spring do not rise more than 5 feet.

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Rising Ground, the slope of it towards the flat looked rich, this part is not so thickly covered as that near the Sea.

A very extensive flat on each side the River, which appeared at least 40 Miles in circumference, reaching a long way to the southward and westward, and not so much covered with trees as the coast near us.

The River is about 10 to 15 yards wide, and the colour of the water reddish - generally about 6 or 7 feet water in the middle. - About a mile and a half up Mr Pullen was checked by a shoal which our gig could not pass, and he had to abandon the search for the present, but he reports deep water again on the other side of this shoal, which was very narrow, but the tide ebbing fast he had not time to try tracking the boat over.
